Community Health and Nutrition Program 559.263.1583

Central Valley Health Network Collaborative educates kids, adults, and elders, 5 – 65 years of age, about the importance of eating healthy and incorporating physical activities as ways of preventing obesity and diabetes. Outreach workers provide health and nutrition information including healthy recipes, senior meals program pamphlets, and food stamp enrollment the third Tuesday of each month between 9:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m. in NYC's Small Conference Room. Partners include Central Valley Health Network, Central California Regional Obesity Prevention, Latino Health Campaign, Champion for Change, and others.

Employment and Training - Workforce Connection & Younger Youth Program 559.263.1100

Workforce Connection incorporates a comprehensive array of services geared at preparing unemployed, underemployed and displaced workers for participation into the labor force resulting in improved long-term employability, increased employment and earnings, and reduced welfare dependency. The Younger Youth Program provides services that will keep currently enrolled students engaged in education, the pursuit of high school graduation and becoming a positive contributing member of society. It is the goal of this program to assist students, ages 14 – 18 years, with increasing their academic competencies and preparing them to enter the world of work or higher education while also helping the student to shape their own destiny. Outreach workers for both programs will enroll eligible clients into the program as well as provide program presentations and career counseling the second and fourth Friday of the month between 9:00 a.m. – 9:30 a.m. (except holidays) in NYC's Large Conference Room. Career preparation workshops will be available to enrolled clients by appointment only.

Farm Stand 559.263.1583

EOC's Farm Stand at NYC will provide residents and visitors of west Fresno access to healthy and locally grown produce. WIC vouchers for fresh fruits and vegetables will be accepted by most vendors. The Farm Stand will take place the first and second Monday of each month in NYC's parking lot between 9 a.m. – 4 p.m. (excluding holidays)

Health Services Clinic's health educators and outreach workers offer workshops to teens and young adults 12 – 18 years in NYC's Large Conference Room the third Tuesday of each month between 9:00 a.m. – 11 a.m. (excluding holidays). Teen Connection guides teens by offering comprehensive teen pregnancy prevention educational programs that equip teens at high risk for pregnancy with knowledge, understanding, and behavioral skills necessary to make responsible decisions regarding at-risk behavior. Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) and Emergency Crisis Intervention Program (HEAP / ECIP) 559.263.1135

Programs assist eligible low-income Fresno County residents annually with a payment toward their PG&E bill; wood, propane, oil, or gas bill; PG&E 48-hour notice, or PG&E shut off. On the first and second Monday of each month between 9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. (excluding holidays), program employees provide intake to clients seeking energy assistance and referrals to EOC's Weatherization program. West Fresno Faith Based Organization (WFFBO)

WIC is a special supplemental nutrition program that helps improve the lifelong health and nutrition of pregnant women, new mothers (breastfeeding and non-breastfeeding), infants, and children up to 5 years by providing nutrition education, nutrient-rich supplemental food, and health and social service referrals. Intake workers will enroll clients in WIC the third Wednesday of every month between 2:00 p.m. – 5:00 p.m. (excluding holidays) in NYC's Small Conference Room.

YouthBuild Charter School of California Central 559.264.1048

YouthBuild Charter School of California Central provides a project-based high school curriculum to young adults, ages 18 – 24 years, interested in obtaining their high school diploma. The school is open to the public and Local Conservation Corps corpsmembers. Once students are enrolled, they have the opportunity to apply for vocational training positions through Local Conservation Corps. Enrollment is ongoing. Classes are Monday thru Friday from September 7, 2011 – June 27, 2012, between 8:30 a.m. – 3:30 p.m. (excluding holidays).
